Dear Alumni,

Happy New Year! I hope that 2010 has begun for you in a positive way. As I write to you, our students are busy with January mid-term exams, final exams for half-year courses, and Regents exams. This year we have put more emphasis on the mid-term exam process. This new focus has several outcomes. First, as we have developed a focused climate with our teaching staff around the tenets of the professional learning community, we have come to understand the critical importance of the formative assessment process. The mid-term exam process allows us to process check student learning, make adjustments with curriculum, and focus on individual learning needs for the second semester. Second, the process has significantly raised the academic bar for students, particularly those in Advanced Placement courses, as well as in the areas of Mathematics and Science. We feel this increased focus will pay dividends with our students as we approach June. Third, we must begin to prepare our students for the rigors of post secondary life. Student learning is at an important crossroads in the United States. The world that American public high schools have traditionally prepared graduates for has changed dramatically. The high school diploma is a new beginning, not an end. We must challenge our students to seek new heights with their commitment to their own learning and their own intellectual development. The future of our country is at stake. All

Head Coach at
Bowling Green**

In keeping up with the outstanding career of **David Clawson, Class of 1985**, he is now the head coach at Bowling Green University a Division I-A school. His team finished with a 7-5 record after a 1-4 start gaining a bowl bid to the Humanitarian Bowl in Boise, Idaho. Bowling Green lost to Idaho on a two-point conversion for an exciting finish to a closely contested game (43-42). "This was a truly great game between two teams that left everything they had on the field of play," said Kevin McDonald, executive director of the Roady's Humanitarian Bowl. "I applaud the players, the universities and the fans for contributing to one of the best games in the Bowl's history."

In November, he led his team to a nationally-televised game at UB Stadium, where he worked as an assistant coach for the Bulls in the early nineties. When interviewed by the Niagara Gazette, Dave said, "It's going to be special, coming home to where I grew up and played high school, when I got this job and saw the game on the schedule, I started looking

forward to it."

Other Lew-Port alumni were also excited about Dave's return to the Western New York area. Fellow high school teammates: Matt Bradshaw, Alan Elia and Pat Krawczyk were in attendance at the game cheering on Dave's team The night before the group got together for dinner to catch up with each other. For this group, following Dave's coaching career has been a tradition. His former teammates think the old shooting guard is up for the challenge. Alan has seen a game at each of Clawson's coaching stops--Albany, Villanova, Fordham, Richmond and Tennessee. Also in attendance was Jim Walker, Class of 1956, and their high school basketball and football coach. Coaching is in this class's blood with Matt Bradshaw coaching the Lew-Port varsity girls' basketball team and Pat Krawczyk coaching the Lew-Port boys' varsity basketball team. "I usually root for the home team, but ...I'll be rooting for Bowling Green," said Pat. "Never thought he was going to coach when we were

younger," said Krawczyk. "But then when I found out he was getting into it. I thought about it. He has the demeanor and he does things the right way."

This opinion seems to be unanimous as Matt Bradshaw added, "he's the kind of guy who was going to be successful in anything he wanted to do. Everything he did he did seriously. He always had a business-like attitude." Mark Johnson, Class of 1975, the former Lancers Assistant Coach could tell Dave had a career on the sidelines. "He was always very cerebral," Johnson said. "He was a student of the game, always questioning in practice why we'd do what we did. He'd have suggestions on how we could tweak a play. He had coaching in his blood."

In his press conference on January 14, 2010, Dave said he would be bragging about his great recruitment class, but wanted to be bragging about them in two years. He said Bowling Green had a lot of needs in this class as the team would be replacing 16 starters. One big need was defensive backs; a position Dave played and knows a lot about from his days at Lew-Port.

this from a mid-term exam week you might say! The stakes are that high. At Lewiston-Porter High School we will continue to seek new ways to meet the challenges of the 21st century learning.

On February 2nd we held our first 8th Grade Orientation Night for the incoming class of 2014. Think about it, these young men and women will celebrate their 50th reunion in 2064. What will our world, our country, our local communities look like in 2064? I believe Lewiston-Porter High School is preparing our students for success for the next 50 years. Our international program is an outstanding example of this cutting edge preparation. As I write to you, I am making final preparations for attendance at an International Water Forum in Kyoto, Japan. I will be accompanied by two students – Brandon Doring, Grade 11 and Theodore Wishowski, Grade 11, and two Science teachers, Mrs. Michelle Hinchliffe and Mrs. Colleen Glor. The students and teachers will be presenting on Niagara Falls and new turbine technology that is being implemented for hydroelectric

power production here in the United States and Canada. The event will allow us to showcase the impact that local initiatives and technologies are having on world hydroelectric power. Our sister school, No. 2 High School, Tianjin, China will also be present at the conference, as well as schools from Japan, China, Canada, Europe and Indonesia. It should prove to be a great opportunity for Lewiston-Porter High School to step out on the world academic stage.

On February 12th, applications will have been due from interested 9th grade students for acceptance into our newly formed International Business and Finance Academy. The Academy is our latest signature academic program. The program has been developed in conjunction with the National Academy Foundation and will be our first foray into the “school within a school” concept. We hope to establish cohorts of 20 to 25 new students each school year, eventually capping enrollment at 80 to 100 students. The International Business Academy will offer students the opportunity to experience first hand the world of international business and finance. With partnerships established with Niagara University and local international businesses, we hope this innovative program will offer our students a significant leg up as they prepare for post-secondary and career opportunities. In talking about this new adventure, Andy said, “There was always the fear for my family and of the risk, but being laid off kind of forced my hand.”

Andy hopes to be able to find more money to help their students get the best financial package possible and weed through the complex paperwork. As the high cost of education continues to rise, his goal is to minimize the stress and save the family money. So when the student gets to school, the parents will have a clear understanding of how they will pay for the loan. “I've realized it just eases their stress and their time consumption

with the process,” he said. “It's a very confusing process if you're not used to handling your own taxes and the financial aid offices aren't going to sit down with each student and talk through it.”

Andy was a well known student/athlete at Lewiston-Porter where he played soccer. He continued the sport at West Virginia University. He is a member of the Class of 2008 Lew-Port Athletic Hall of Fame. Andy and his wife, Kristen live in Youngstown with their two boys Drew and Luke. He is the son of

William, Class of 1965, and Judy Leardini a retired kindergarten teacher at Lew-Port.

Bobby Martin, Class of 1974, took first place at the NHRA U.S. Labor Day weekend at the O'Reilly Raceway Park at Indianapolis in the top alcohol funny car class. He started racing in 1985 and turned professional in 1991. “It's the biggest event anybody can win in the sport. Her position involves the processing and maintenance of the Museum's three dimensional pieces. By caring for the artifacts and recording the history and donor's story on each piece, she is actively preserving history, honoring the excellence of players' performance and character while creating a permanent record for future generations. Mary enjoys speaking with the people who have their own precious memories or actual pieces of baseball history. "It is fun to listen to their stories and give them pointers about caring for what they have" Mary

added "I love being able to share the passion of baseball with so many different people from all over the world. We all come from different backgrounds and life experiences, but baseball is a universal language. I especially enjoy trying to find something of interest in our collection that will be appreciated by the least interested visitor. Often people think of the Hall of Fame as strictly "baseball" and are surprised that we house much more than bats, gloves and baseballs. We house "culture" and share stories about everyday people." When asked who was her favorite Hall of Famer, she replied, "My favorite is the Hall of Famer on whose artifact I'm currently working or researching." At the time this was written, Mary was working on Robin Roberts.

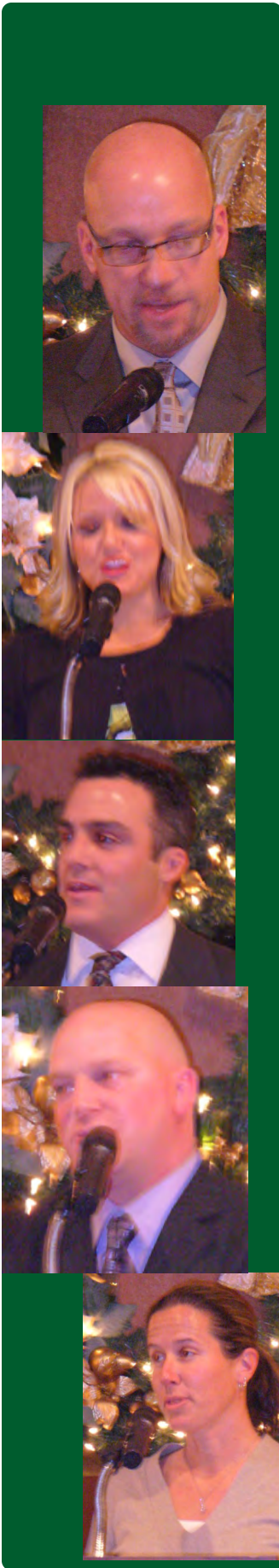

Lew-Port's Sports Hall of Fame



Lewiston-Porter Athletics held their annual Hall of Fame Induction Dinner at the Como Restaurant on Friday, December 4, 2009. The committee included Scott Townsend, Athletic Director; Paul Casseri, High School Principal; Cynthia Bullis, Coach; James Walker, Retired Coach; Randi Lombardo, Coach; and Linda D'Anna, Coach/Varsity Club Advisor. The following graduates were inducted that night.

Matt Bradshaw **Class of 1986**

Matt was a four year letter winner, playing basketball from 1982-1986, including the NFL Championship team in 1984-85. He is one of the most accomplished scorers in Lancer basketball history, as he became the 2nd player in history to reach 1,000 points during his senior year. He was the first Lancer to reach 500 rebounds, and the first player to achieve the 500 rebound/1,000 point plateau. He was All Area as a sophomore, and All NFL during his sophomore, junior and senior years. Matt lettered in football and track and was captain of the football team his senior year. Matt is a Physical Education teacher and is the Varsity girls basketball coach at Lew-Port.

Nancy Rose-Brown **Class of 1994**

Nancy received nine letters in her years as a Lancer athlete, receiving three each in volleyball, basketball and track. The majority of her successes came on the volleyball court. She was a major contributor on

Lancer teams that had a 38-3 record. During her tenure on the team, they won three League, two Sectional and one Far West Regional titles. Nancy was 1st Team All League as a senior and the team captain. In track, she placed in the top six in the NFL in the 200 meter, 400 meter and 400 relay over the course of three years.

Jeff Shewan, Class of 1991

Jeff is one of the most decorated three sport athletes that Lew-Port has seen. He played football, wrestled, and ran track during his high school career. Jeff was a two-year starter for the football team as a running back and defensive back. He was All League and All Area selection, while gaining 1,171 offensive yards as a senior and scoring eight touchdowns. He was also second on the team with 87 tackles on defense. He set school records at the time for the longest punt return and most pass receptions in a game. As a wrestler, he was the NFL Champion at 132 pounds as a senior, and was the runner up in Section 6. He recorded a 44/16 record in his career. In track, Jeff was a three-year All Area selection, was co-holder of the 440 relay team record, and was the NFL Champion in the 100 yard dash.

Ken Tewsley, Class of 1989

Ken is one of the few athletes who has received letters in four different sports at Lew-Port: soccer, basketball, base-

ball, and track. His accolades on the soccer field are some of the best in Lew-Port's history. He was a three year starter, while earning 1st Team All League honors for three straight seasons. He was All Western New York for two years, and received prestigious honors as an All State and Regional All American as a senior. Ken played two years of basketball and was 1st Team All League as a senior. He also competed in baseball and track for one year each. Ken earned seven varsity letters in his career.

Joanna Tower **Class of 1992**

Joanna is widely regarded as one of the top three sport athletes that Lew-Port has seen. She earned twelve varsity letters while at Lew-Port. She played three varsity sports per year for all four years. Her accomplishments in soccer are unprecedented. She was All League for three years, All Western New York for two years, and was 2nd Team All State as a senior in 1991. As a team captain, Joanna helped lead her team to an appearance in the State Semi-Finals. She completed her career with 56 goals and 45 assists. On the basketball court, Joanna helped lead her team to a Sectional Championship in her senior year, as well as an appearance in the State Semi-Finals in 1992. Joanna's third sport was softball.

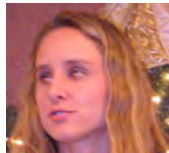

David earned nine varsity letters as a Lew-Port athlete. He excelled in three sports and served as the Captain of all three sports. In football, David was a 1st Team All League, 1st Team All WNY as a senior, and a member of the All WNY Academic Football team. He held several records including most defensive interceptions in a game, season and career. In baseball, David received honors as a 1st Team All League selection and All WNY Academic team. He set league and school records in strikeouts and winning percent-

age as a pitcher. David captained the Empire State Gold Medal team in 1993. David was a standout basketball player and was named to the All League Honorable Mention his senior year.



**Debra Zevetchin (Varney),
Class of 1994**

Debra earned eleven varsity letters in three sports: volleyball, basketball and track. In volleyball, she was a two time 1st Team All League selection and an All State Honorable Mention selection as a junior. Debra was captain of three straight league champion-

ship teams, three Sectional championship teams as well as a Regional championship. The volleyball team's record during her tenure was 54-6. She earned four varsity letters in basketball. In track, Debra was a 1st Team All League selection in 1992, and finished in the top five in the 400 hurdles and the high jump. She was also a Sectional finalist in the high jump as a senior.
