During his time at Lewiston-Porter High School, Jason epitomized the ideals of hard work, commitment, and dedication. He was an outstanding student and cross-country and track athlete. Gary and Jason provide an excellent example for all members of the Lewiston-Porter community. The proceeds from the race support the many scholarship programs sponsored by the Lewiston-Porter Alumni Association. Unique for this year is moving the race to the newly designed LP X-Country course. Lewiston-Porter is one of only two schools in Western New York with a X-Country course on the campus.
