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BLENDER EVENT WITH ADVISORY BOARD

Academy students were provided with an opportunity to implement the FOSTER Method of Conversation at a blender event with Academy Advisory Board members on February 1st. The FOSTER Method provides students with an easy to remember acronym to recall questions to ask to strike up a conversation with someone they have just met.

The second part of the FOSTER method consists of listening to the other person and continuing the conversation with follow-up questions. The magic of the follow-up questioning lies in the simplicity of being a good, active listener. Implementing the FOSTER method provides students practice to gain confidence in the ability to have deep, meaningful conversations with others as opposed to meaningless surface talk, S (School) T (Travel) E (Eat) R (Recreation) such as discussing the weather.



COLLEGE 101 FIELD TRIP

In March, Academy students visited Canisius College for "College 101." Canisius President Steve Stoute welcomed students and provided opening remarks, followed by a "College 101" presentation delivered by Laura McEwen, Associate Dean, Wehle School of Business (WSB) and Dr. Denise Rotondo, Dean of WSB. Students learned about what to expect in the transition from high school to college followed by a Q&A session with a panel of students and Zachary McGurk, Assistant Professor, Economics & Finance. The panel answered questions and shared stories about their own personal experiences, lessons learned and advice they would give their younger self. Students were then provided with a full campus tour and bag lunch. The field trip culminated with a stop at Platters.

CLASSROOM SPEAKERS

CPAs Ben Schuver of Brisbane Consulting Group and Michael Carroll of Yugabyte presented on career opportunities in accounting to students in Mrs. Krawczyk's College Level Accounting classes. The role of accounting as the "language of business" was discussed. Schuver presented what a "Day in the Life" of a CPA looks like including hours and work requirements, culture, workflow (technology/site visits/phone & virtual calls), and research and continuing education requirements. Carroll presented on CPAs in Cybersecurity and discussed topics including the importance of cybersecurity, best practices, and costs of security breaches. He spoke about his personal career journey and also gave students an idea of what a "day in the life of a CPA in Cybersecurity" looks like with a breakdown of daily responsibilities in percentages and shared about lessons he has learned on his journey.

MOCK INTERVIEWS

In April, Mike Skowronski, Assistant Director of Career Services at Niagara University came to Lew-Port to speak to juniors about what to expect interview. Skowronski during an discussed interview tips and strategies including the STAR method which is a structured manner of responding to a behavioral-based interview question by discussing the specific situation, task, action and result of the situation you are describing. Each student was also provided with a copy of Niagara University's Get HIRED! book.



In May, Skowronski returned to campus with Niagara University Career Counselor Krista Massaro (pictured above at left) to conduct behavior-based mock interviews with situational questions.

Each student interviewed with either Skowronski or Massaro and were provided with constructive feedback during the interview process. Students then had a second interview with an Academy Advisory Board Member allowing them an opportunity to implement what they learned from the feedback they received in their initial interview.


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NEW LOGO TO REFLECT NEW ACADEMY FOCUS

NEW ACADEMY DIRECTOR BRIAN HALL


