Pillar 1 - Teaching and Learning

- As the 20 week marking period comes to a close on January 24, this is a reminder that <u>report cards are electronic</u> and are NOT printed or sent via mail. Grades and attendance can be accessed through the Powerschool Parent Portal at anytime. A link to the portal can be accessed from our District web page at <u>www.lew-port.com</u>. Report cards can also be accessed by using your parent created Powerschool account. If you need assistance in setting up this account or have questions regarding access, please contact the Guidance office at <u>bvandeusen@lewport.com</u> or (716) 286-7208.
- After School Assistance Program is continuing for those students that had two or more failing marks for the second Quarter (15 week mark) or who continue to struggle. As a reminder, each grade level has a designated day each week for ASAP: <u>Monday - Grade 8</u> <u>Wednesday - Grade 6</u> <u>Thursday - Grade 7</u>
- On Tuesday, January 21 and Wednesday, January 22, we will be administering our Winter Benchmark AIMSWeb screening to ALL students at LPMS. ELA screening will be administered on Tuesday and Math will be administered on Wednesday. ALL students will be assessed during the first two periods of each day using a chromebook and headphones or earbuds. STUDENTS SHOULD PLEASE BRING EARBUDS OR HEADPHONES WITH THEM FOR THOSE TWO DAYS. We will run a modified schedule for remainder of those two days to account for the 45-60 minutes that that screening will take to implement. AIMSWeb Plus is a web based screening that we use 3 times per year as part of our benchmark assessments to assist us in monitoring the reading and math skills of our students. The screening uses a robust set of standard-aligned measures, and has been proven to uncover learning gaps quickly, identify at-risk students, and assess individual and classroom growth.
- SAVE THE DATE! On Thursday, February 6, the High School will be hosting an 8th Grade transition night for all students and families in 8th grade who will be transitioning to the High School next year. This event will take place in the High School Auditorium from 6:00pm 7:30pm. The goal of this transition night is to help create a better understanding of the programs and courses that are offered at the High School along with introducing students to the many opportunities of high school student life including extra-curricular activities and athletics. The Academic Departments will have information tables set up for you to visit from 5:30 6:00 pm outside of the auditorium and the program will continue in the auditorium at approximately 6:00 pm. This will be the first of many opportunities your son or daughter will have to familiarize themselves with the many aspects of student life at the High School. From this meeting your counselors at the Middle School, Ms. Wright and Mrs. Stack, will begin the scheduling process for the 9th grade year.
- We are excited that our 6th grade will now be a part of the *One District, One Book* initiative! This initiative is designed to create a shared reading experience across an entire school community. The voting for the book to read ended on Saturday, January 11 with students casting their vote at local libraries. The choice to make is whether we want to read *The One and Only Ivan* by Katherine Applegate or *Rump: The (Fairly) True Story of Rumpelstiltskin* by Liesl Shurtliff. The book chosen by the students will be provided to every student and participants will follow a common schedule across the district. This initiative has been very successful at both the PEC and IEC and we look forward to finding out what book our 6th graders will be reading at the "reveal" on January 22 at the Lewiston Public Library.

- Students in Ms. Alexander's 7th grade science classes have been engaging in the skill of "engaging in argument from evidence" as part of the implementation of one of the science and engineering practices. Students in her classes investigated and came up with evidence on the essential question of "How is the strength of an electromagnet affected by the number of turns of wire in a coil?" Working in groups, the students needed to answer 4 essential questions based upon their evidence gathering process:
 - What patterns exist between my data and the data from the other groups?
 - How can I justify my results using science vocabulary and concepts?
 - How can I think and communicate with clarity and precision?
 - How can I engage in productive argument from evidence?
- Our music department continues to provide students with opportunities to show off their outstanding talents to family and friends with some upcoming events:

★ Teacher leadership

A group of 10-12 teachers and counselors recently attended a two day workshop relating to the concept of Restorative Practices using Classroom Circles. This concept is something that we are looking to implement in our Advisory period next year. This concept helps to establish a foundation in classrooms to help build a stronger sense of community and to cultivate a culture in which everyone feels like they belong. These practices help to build a sense of community in which EVERY person feels that they are seen, heard, and respected. All who attended have reported the value that this will bring to our school and classrooms.

Pillar 3 - Community and Culture

Lewiston-Porter is pleased to announce that we will begin using the Raptor Visitor Management System to strengthen our program of building safety for students and faculty. Part of keeping students and faculty safe is knowing who is in our buildings at all times, and the Raptor system will allow us to do that. The Raptor system will better allow us to screen visitors, contractors, and volunteers in our schools and provide us with a safer environment for our students and staff. Upon entering a district building, *visitors will be asked to present an ID such as a Driver's License*, which can either be scanned or manually entered into the system. If a parent or

guardian for any reason does not have a US government-issued ID, a school staff member can manually enter the person's name into the Raptor system. Lewiston-Porter Middle School is excited to be piloting this system effective **January 1**st of 2020, as part of a school safety grant, and this system is currently being used in the main office. The District anticipates bringing the other schools on campus online at the beginning of the next school year

- As part of the work on our strategic plan, we are looking for input on how to define student success. Some people prefer more traditional ways and others like less traditional measures.
