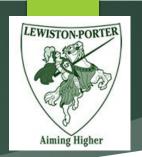

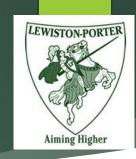
Budget Goals

Lewiston Porter CSD 2022-2023 Budget Development Process

Steps:

- Review the Strategic Educational Plan to ensure the budget reflects our school district mission
- 2. Carefully plan with building administrators the expenditures needed to support the instructional programs within their schools
- 3. Estimate State Aid & Project local revenues
- 4. Analyze levy to be used (Revenues must equal planned expenditures)
- 5. Calculate the tax rate by dividing the share of the tax levy into the taxable assessed value of the township (after vote)

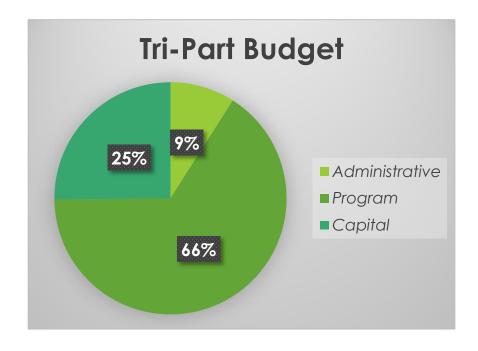

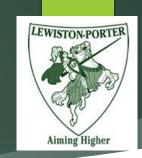
Changes in STAR and equalization rates may impact tax rates.



- Contingency budget
- **\$52,359,286**
- Requires \$758,312 additional cuts from current budget
- ► Would require reduction or elimination of:
 - all furniture and equipment, conferences, field trips, athletics, and intramurals.

Proposition 1- Annual Budget \$53,117,598 (2.69 % tax levy increase)

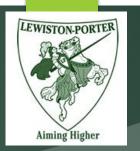
