Where do I start the whole process?

**Common Application - <https://www.commonapp.org/> Universal application that hundreds of schools use. It allows you to fill out one application and have it sent to several schools. You will send a link via email to your counselor and teachers for transcript and recommendation information to be sent to each individual college. App fees vary

**SUNY application and supplemental form (REQUIRED) (\$50.00 app fee) www.SUNY.edu You can also use common app to apply to SUNY schools This would take care of main application and supplemental.

**You will need the email address of your counselor and teachers for recommendations. You will find these on the high school webpage.

**If a school is requiring you to send your SAT and/or ACT scores right from the testing service (these are called “official scores”) you will need to log onto your SAT and or ACT account and have them sent (this will cost you \$\$).

Letters of Recommendation

~Letters of recommendation- You will need 1-3 depending on where you apply (you can get more if you choose).

~Brag sheets!!! What is the brag sheet? It is your chance to write down all of the activities and awards you have achieved over the last 4 years.

~Please complete your Brag Sheet via our website or by clicking the link above. You will receive a copy via email once it is completed.

~You can then forward a copy of the brag sheet to the teacher(s) you have asked to write you a recommendation letter. Please be aware that a teacher **MUST** have this in order to write you a letter.

Deadlines

- All applications should be in by December 1st. Some applications will have a deadline in January or February however, you should not WAIT UNTIL THE LAST DAY!!
- For those students interested in attending Niagara University next year, there will be rapid admission days on October 23rd and 24th.
- For those students interested in attending NCCC next year there will be instant enrollment days on November 1st and 2nd.
 - *For those who would like to apply to NCCC on their own you can do this directly from their [website](#) Please make sure you let your counselor know if you applied so we can send your transcript.

Have you heard of.....

- Early Decision – Usually November 1st deadline to apply. You find out the admissions decision sooner and if accepted you rescind all other college applications. A binding agreement.
- Early Action – earlier deadline to apply (typically November 15th). You find out the admissions decision sooner, but there is NO binding agreement.
- Not all schools offer Early Decision and or Early Action. Check the schools you are interested in.
- Rolling Admission – Schools accept and Deny applicants as they come in. There is no official application deadline.

Yippee!! College Admissions Tests

- Many colleges and Universities are still waiving the testing requirement. Please check each school you are interested in to see what their policy is.
- SAT Test Dates—
 - October 7, 2023 (reg. deadline 9/7/22, late reg 9/26/22)
 - November 4th, 2024 (reg. deadline 10/5/22, late reg. 10/24/22)
 - March 9th, 2024 (reg. deadline 2/23/2024, late reg. 2/27/24)
 - May 4th, 2024 (reg. deadline 4/19/2024, late reg. deadline 4/23/2024)
- ***Important information about SAT. No admission ticket and photo ID...no admission. See the handouts.**

NCAA Eligibility Center

·If you plan to play a Division I or II sport you must register with the NCAA Eligibility Center. They determine if you meet the eligibility requirements. You need 16 approved credits to be eligible.

·After you register, *you need to let your counselor know so we can upload your transcript.*

What do colleges look for in prospective students?

- Grade point average (GPA)
- Class rank
- SAT and / or ACT scores (if not waived)
- What classes you have taken ALL 4 years (including senior year) of high school (rigor of program)
- Regents exam scores
- Letters of Recommendation
- Extra-curricular activities
- Essays (if requested)
- Social media??!!!
