Remote Lancers

f you are considering the 100% remote learning option, you probably have questions about the curriculum and instruction that your child would receive.

Regardless of if children are learning on-campus or remotely, we are committed to providing students with the best educational experience. The information shared in this document provides highlights regarding both (a) our curriculum that we will use with our Remote Lancers and (b) how we will instruct Remote Lancers.

LEARNING STANDARDS

The NYS Education Department (NYSED) establishes the standards that students must learn by grade level. One way to think about the standards is that they are the "learning outcomes" for all students across the state no matter which school district the students are enrolled in. This is the state's way to set the bar for what NYS students should know and be able to do as a result of their time in NYS schools.

School districts in NYS have the ability to choose their curriculum (the resources used to teach students) and their instruction (the way that the students are taught). These are within local control. Families who choose to homeschool their children are able to choose the curriculum and instruction that will meet the standards.

Regardless of if students are Remote Lancers, On-Campus Lancers, or homeschooled, all the curriculum and instruction should be aligned to meet the expectations laid out in the NYS Learning standards. On-Campus Lancers

ue to COVID-19, accommodations and modifications are needed to meet the safety requirements for returning to school. We are committed to keeping everyone on campus safe and healthy during their on-campus instruction. We are also dedicated to ensuring on-campus will have access to the same teachers and programs that they have come to know and expect.

Special Education

Our Remote and On-Campus Lancers will Have Access to Certified Special Education Teachers and Related Service Providers

To receive the services outlined in the students' Individualized Education Plan (IEP), students with disabilities who are Remote Lancers (learning off campus 100% of the time) will have access to certified special education teachers and/or related service providers (ex. speech teachers). The special education teachers and/or related service providers will be in regular communication with families and with teachers on campus to ensure that the instruction is of the highest level regardless of where the instruction takes place.

Students with disabilities who participate in the Hybrid Model and attend a class with a specialized setting

(meaning a 6:1:1, 12:1:1, or 15:1:1 class) will be on-campus Tuesday-Thursday in order to meet their IEP goals.

Finally, students with disabilities who are not in a class with a specialized setting and participating in the Hybrid Model will be in the Green or White Group, attending two (2) days on-campus and two (2) days at home. On the home learning days, the students will engage in asynchronous learning. On Mondays, students will participate in whole– or smallgroup synchronous learning according to a K-5 and a 6-12 schedule.

English Language Learners

Our Remote and On-Campus Lancers will Have Access to Certified Teachers of English as a Second Language

The spring 2020 COVID-19 crisis was extremely challenging for all students, but created particular difficulties for our most vulnerable students, including English Language Learners (ELLs). NYS Department of Education strongly encouraged school districts to provide additional supports to ELLs to ensure that their unique needs are met.

To achieve this target, our ELLs will participate in on-campus learning Tuesday-Thursday and receive synchronous remote learning on Mondays. Instruction will be provided by certified content area teachers and teachers with a certification in English as a Second Language. On Mondays, in addition to participating in the synchronous learning provided by the content area teachers for all students, English as a Second Language teachers will schedule time to communicate with families.

Our K-5 Remote Lancers will Have Access to Certified Teachers

Based on the number of students in K-5 who are Remote Lancers, we will have one or more Lew-Port teachers dedicated to the instruction of these students. Remote Lancer teachers will check in with students on a regular basis to ensure that their learning (both social/emotionally and academically) is on target. These teachers will be in regular communication with families and with teachers oncampus. This way, when Remote Lancers come back to campus at some point in the future, they will be on-par with students who were learning on-campus.

On-Campus Lancer Curriculum

The Options Available to Our 6-12 On-Campus Lancers Are Too Vast to Adequately Share Here...Noted Below Are Some Highlights

MIDDLE SCHOOL

- ⇒ Focus on Social/Emotional Wellness: We will continue to use the "Where Everyone Belongs" (WEB) program that helps incoming 6th grade students gain comfort in the middle school and provides 8th grade students with the chance to be leaders. As well, all middle school students participate in a daily experience called "Necessary Emotional Support Time," or NEST, where students in small groups have the chance to grow and develop their social and emotional wellness under the guidance of a caring teacher.
- ⇒ **Teaming**: Students in the middle school are placed in teams so that all students on the team have the same teachers who collaborate to ensure that the students are thriving academically and socially/emotionally. This also allows parents to work with a core group of teachers for communication and support.
- ⇒ Innovation Experience: Formally known as the "8th Grade Honors Project," students will continue to have the opportunity to participate in this year-long experience to expand their thinking and hone their soft-skills for high school and beyond.
- ⇒ Advanced Coursework: Based on their success in 7th grade, students in 8th grade will still be able to participate in Algebra and a Regents-level science course.

HIGH SCHOOL

- ⇒ Advanced Placement and College-Level Courses: We will continue to offer our full array of AP and college-level courses to students.
- ⇒ International Business and Finance Academy: Interested students participate in a unique school-within-a-school approach to education designed to prepare students for future academic and career success. Our Academy students come to the program with a variety of interests and abilities, but all are looking for a different high school experience that will provide them with the knowledge and skills that will take them from high-school, to advanced education or training, and beyond.
- ⇒ Multi-Age English Language Arts: The structure of our ELA curriculum is going to change dramatically starting this fall now that we will be offering electives for students for the first semester of the school year. Students will be in multi-age (10th-12th grade) classes learning side-by-side with their peers who have similar interests. Students will continue in these configuations for the second semester when they have a quarter dedicated to writing and one dedicated to Shakespeare.
- ⇒ Cutting Edge Performing and Visual Arts: We are proud of our rich history of support for the Fine Arts at Lewiston-Porter. We are also proud that we have created our facilities to accommodate dedicated spaces for art and music within each building and are creatively finding ways to continue this important work with social-distancing in place.

Hybrid Model Summary

Based on guidance from the New York State Department of Health, the Niagara County Department of Health, and the New York State Education Department, a hybrid learning model which addresses the health and safety of our students will be employed to begin the 2020-2021 school year.

This means that on defined days, some students learn remotely and others learn at school. This limits the number of students in classrooms, on buses, and in the hallways at one time thereby allowing for social distancing to be maintained in classrooms during instruction.
