# PEC New Master Schedule

The positive impact of our new master schedule will finally be implemented in a five day instructional model. Students benefit from a new 6 day rotation with a 33% increase of Music and Art. Kindergartners will also have an increase in library media instruction for the first two trimesters, followed by STEAM in the final trimester of the school year. STEAM instruction will now be year round for our students in first and second grade twice in a six day rotation. In addition to our library media specialist, Mrs. Zielinski will be supporting enrichment, coding and technology cross connect during flexible blocks. 

# **An Ocean of Possibilities**

180 students registered for our elementary summer camp program. K-5 Primary students were rotated through reading, writing and math lessons in a departmentalizing model offering students opportunities for movement and specialization in each core discipline. Every primary student left camp with a portfolio of their work. Our intermediate level students worked on interdisciplinary projects together. The teachers have weaved in the ocean and animal research projects into ELA and part of the math instruction. The teachers utilized a book series that they incorporated as a read aloud for close reading strategies. Interactive notebooks and writing journals were used daily. A Junior Counselor component was incorporated to support middle and high school students who are interested in education. Last fall 2021, teachers piloted Reveal Math and INTO Math. Thank you to Katie Ries, Kelly Milleville, Christa Mauro and Sonja Marchetti who offered to pilot Reveal math in their classrooms. Thank you to Darcy Allendar, Claudine Carlo, Lisa Winslow and Sonja who offered to pilot INTO Math in their classrooms. We appreciate that Sonja has the opportunity to experience both pilots while working in the ICT classrooms.

Teachers were provided with criteria to evaluate both programs and share feedback with their teams. After careful consideration and reflection, INTO Math was chosen. This math program will be used in all grades K-2. We have completed our first training on Aug 12, 2022. Teachers who are not available on that day have the opportunity to participate in September training. Training will continue throughout the school year with a representative from INTO math.

Grade level math materials have arrived and the pallets were unloaded and sorted for classrooms. We are grateful for this math program but we are very aware that our teachers and continued PD, as well as their experience is what make our students the most successful!

# **Phonics Program Words Their Way**



Teachers in grade K-2 will be utilizing the Words Their Way(WTW) phonics program during their literacy block. WTW uses a spelling inventory to assess students' development spelling stage and then individualizes lessons to meet their needs. Teachers will be receiving training as well and materials have been ordered.


