### **Items of Note**

- Quarter 2 (20 Weeks): ends January 24th
- Mid Terms will be the week of January 21-24

#### FBI Presentation

- January 31 Students at all grade levels will be attending a presentation during the first 3 periods.
- This presentation was recommended by our SRO's and will be very beneficial for our students relating to appropriate technology usage.
- This presentation is entitled "Your Device, Your Safety, Your Future." It is designed for middle schoolers and focuses specifically on internet safety and online dangers. Students will be given information about who an online predator is, what they want (sextortion and online enticement), and ways they can be empowered to protect themselves.
