## Monday, July 24,2023

## General

We will continue to adapt as necessary and hopefully be ready for 6th grade orientation on August 16.

### **Past Events**

- The 8th Grade Moving up Celebration on June 23 was a great success! A huge "Thank you" the entire 8th grade team but especially to Nina Calarco and Liz Buck for their work in putting together our program. Thank you to our PTSA who provided a light breakfast and assisted in this memorable experience for our students.
- Just a reminder that grade reports were NOT sent home. Parents have been given information regarding access to the Parent Portal in Powerschool and how to access grades and report cards.
