Lew-Port Alumni Awarded 2022 Ohio Educator of the Year

Paul Destino, a 1993 Lewiston-Porter graduate was recently named *Ohio Educator-of-the-Year*. The award is the most distinguished honor the Ohio Middle Level Association can bestow upon an individual to recognize his or her contributions to middle level education.

The honor was revealed to Mr. Destino during an all-grades surprise assembly attended by educators, community leaders and Mr. Destino's wife, children and parents. "What an incredible honor," said Mayfield Superintendent Dr. Michael Barnes. "You are a leader of men, of women, and of children. You epitomize what it means to lead from the heart. Never, ever change, my friend. We salute you."

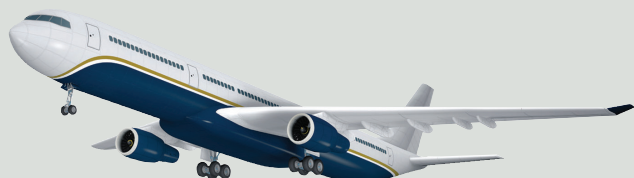
Destino has been an educator for twenty six years, and a Mayfield Middle School Principal for the last seventeen years. When reflecting back to his years at Lew-port, and those people that influenced him, he said, Dr. (Doc) Richard Marotto, is the reason I am a building principal. He knew all of us, let us have fun, and created many memories of school." He added, "Fifth grade was my first year in the district, and no doubt Mrs. Brennan made learning fun! Middle School, brought fond memories of Mr. Sheusi, chaperoning our Washington D.C. Trip." Destino continued, "There were three high school teachers who had influence on me, definitely Senor Richard Hogan, my Spanish Teacher. I won't forget him handing me my diploma when I graduated. Miss Hannah one of my math teachers, had high expectations for all kids, always pushed us to excel. Lastly, Mrs. Shea, my music teacher provided all the fun trips to DC, Myrtle Beach and Boston. All four of them, they were the best! "On a personal note he added, "Of all the people that had influence on me, no doubt my mom and dad were the greatest!"



Students Travel to Six Countries

Lewiston-Porter students were back in the air after a two-year (COVID) hiatus. This summer nine students and two teachers traveled to Eastern Europe to follow an ambitious itinerary, traveling with Education First (EF) tours. The group started in Berlin, Germany, traveled to Dresden (where one student even had family roots!), and took a short drive to Prague, Czechia to explore and see the famous Astrological Clock. From there the group traveled to Krakow, Poland. This was an eye-opening visit, as many refugees from Ukraine have become part of the city (Polish law allows Ukrainian refugees immediate temporary citizenship and access to all social programs.) Arguably the most important part of the 12-day trip took the group to Auschwitz camps I and II; where the students were both saddened and enraged. Teacher chaperone Amy Townsend said "the students had the exact reaction I was hoping for: they were in disbelief of the hatred and small-mindedness that led to the creation of such a place, but agreed that education is the only way to combat such hatred." Following Poland, the students crossed through Slovakia, with a lunch stop in the mountains, on their way to Budapest, Hungary. A night cruise on the Danube River cemented Budapest as their favorite city on the trip. The final stop on the itinerary was Vienna, Austria. Teacher chaperone Max Hyland noted even in Austria, Buffalo Bills fans were present. The trip, delayed again and again due to pandemic-related travel restrictions, was well worth the wait.

Aliscia Krecisz, Elementary (Pre K-5) Elementary Coordinator

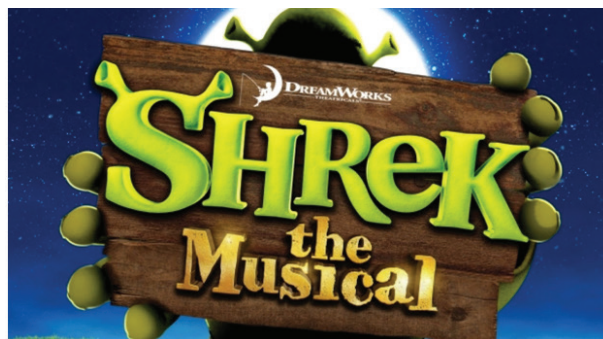

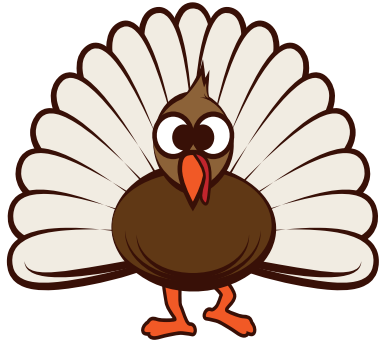


First Grade Students Design Thanksgiving Projects
