Building Bridges...for a Successful Transition

As children journey through their school career at Lewiston-Porter, they must step into unfamiliar territory. It is our responsibility to build bridges between educational programs by providing all children with a compass for direction and purpose as they navigate through each stage of school. As compasses, we do not tell them which path to take, but we serve as a resource, a guide. We can help, suggest, question and



encourage our children as they discover new opportunities and choices on their educational journey. The Primary Educational Center, in collaboration with the Intermediate Educational Center, has developed transitional plans for our children as they prepare for their first transition milestone at Lewiston-Porter. All second graders and

multiage third graders will be visiting the IEC for an assembly. Mrs. Rodriguez and Mrs. Brook will be welcoming the 2nd and multiage third graders to engage in a discussion led by Mrs. Rodriguez, IEC Principal and Mrs. Brook, IEC Social Worker. The students will also have a question and answer session with the IEC Lancer Leaders. In addition, each classroom departing from the PEC is partnered up with an IEC classroom to support their transition. Our students will be invited to the IEC for several visits with their partner class to learn more about the IEC and to engage in exciting activities like a visit to the Living Museum.

We continue to view your child's first educational experience as a partnership between home, school and community. We have thoroughly enjoyed nurturing and celebrating your child's uniqueness while at the PEC. We will truly miss each family leaving us, but know that your child is prepared for all the exciting new opportunities that lie ahead of them. Parents play a critical role in successfully transitioning their children.

Physicals



NEW: Students entering Pre-K, K, 1st and 3rd grades in the fall are required to submit a physical examination report signed by a NYS MD, NP, or PA by September 2019. The physical exams submitted to the PEC health office from now until September 2019 will be valid for next year. The physicals may be dated **September 3, 2018** and after per New York State Law (one year before the start of the new school year). Now is a good time to schedule an appointment with your child's primary care provider. We encourage parents to take their children to see their own health care provider as this is best practice for their continuity of care. Your child's health care provider takes your child's medical history into account and can provide you with the most accurate and up-to-date information about your child. We are

also required by New York State to request a dental health certificate. Thank you to those parents who have already submitted these completed forms. Please keep a copy of any health forms for your own records before submitting them to the PEC.

Immunizations

Immunizations must be up to date according to the NYS regulations for each grade level before the start of school. Please check with your child's Primary Care Physician.

Students who are not in compliance with immunization requirements <u>may be excluded from school attendance upon</u> the 14th day of school.

Medication in School



All medication to be administered in school for next year requires a <u>new</u> order from a child's health care provider for the 2019-2020 school year and a parent signature. Medication (including over the counter meds) are not allowed to be given to a child in school without an order from a health care provider per New York State Law. If your child has medication in school, it will need to be picked up by an adult during the last week of school in June. Medication is <u>not allowed</u> to come to school or to go home in a child's backpack. If not picked up at the end of June, the medication will be discarded.

I will be sending the physical, dental and medication-in-school forms home with your child. Please be aware that the forms are also available at www.lew-port.com in the Health Services section.


