GRADING AND RANKING

A numeric grading system was implemented in the 2003-04 school year. Marks were previously reported using an alpha system. Both an un-weighted and weighted average is reported on the transcript with a corresponding rank. Honors and AP courses are weighted using a 1.1 scale.

All grades earned in all courses are included in the ranking. A student's average and rank are computed at the end of the junior year. However, for the purpose of determining class valedictorian and salutatorian, students will be ranked at the end of the 1st semester of the senior year (end of the seventh semester).

CURRICULUM

There is an extensive range of course offerings to meet the differing needs, abilities, and interests of the students. Many students pursue accelerated courses before entering 9th grade, which are indicated on the transcript. Broad offerings in art, music, business, and technology courses are available to all students as electives. Students may also pursue career and technical education (CTE) during their junior and senior year at the Orleans-Niagara BOCES Vocational Center. The Academy of International Business & Finance is available for students interested in international business studies. International partnerships have been developed with schools around the world including the United Kingdom, France, Italy, Germany, Brazil, Argentina and China. Our partnership in China offers robust teacher/student exchanges. Chinese Language and Culture is currently offered as an elective credit.

Lewiston-Porter's instructional program is designed to encourage students to achieve at the highest possible level, with emphasis on Regents, Honors, and Advanced Placement courses. An Honors Program, which is a combination of Honors, college level, & Advanced Placement (AP) courses, is available for students who desire a strong intellectual challenge. It offers two prestigious accolades: The Lewiston-Porter Honors Diploma and Lewiston-Porter Honors Certificates. The Honors Diploma is awarded for completing the rigorous and comprehensive Honors Program while the Certificates are granted for completing individual departmental requirements. The Advanced Placement program is extensive with offerings of 19 AP courses. They include Art 2-D Design, Art 2-D Portfolio/Photography, Art 3-D Design, Art History, Art-Draw Studio, Biology, Chemistry, Physics C, Environmental Science, Calculus AB, Statistics, English 11, English 12, American History, European History, Government, Politics, & Economics, World History, Psychology, and Spanish. College level courses are Crime Justice, Pre-calculus, Public Speaking, Psychology, Government & Politics, Statistics, French and Spanish. These are offered in affiliation with Niagara University and Niagara County Community College.
