








Middle School Data Regents Living Environment










High School Credit(WHAT do we do when students KNOW it?)

- Three (3) sections of Regents Science
 - 2 sections of Earth Science (Buck) and 1 of Living Environment (Kankolenski)
- Three (3) sections of Regents Algebra 1 (Calarco/Sharpe)
- Provide more opportunities for 8th graders to gain high school credit
 - 55 out of 157 (35%) of 8th grade cohort are currently in Regents Classes

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Curriculum and content(WHAT do we want students to KNOW?)

- ✓ MUST get everyone speaking the same language in terms of curriculum that is being taught at EACH grade level.
- ✓ Slide #9 Identify COMMON curriculum by moving up the Math Curriculum Review
- ✓ Common planning time by grade and content area.
- PLCs Grade Level and vertical content.



RTI... (HOW do we know they KNOW it?)

- ✓ Switch to AIMSWeb Benchmark Assessments Grades 6-8
 - Correlation to the State Assessment Data
 - Inconsistent Goes back to question of "What do we want students to know?"
- ✓ AIS Blocks(WHAT do we do when students don't KNOW it?)
 - After School Assistance Program (ASAP) 3 days per week Grade level specific
 - Split by Grade level and assisted with HS tutors.



High School Highlights



- Peer Coordinators are working diligently on the master schedule for 2020-2021.
- Student Commons has opened and is a big success!
- Breakfast of Champions returned to the cafeteria and was enjoyed by all. 80% of the high school students earned merit roll or higher for the Quarter 1 marking period
- Guidance kiosk featuring scholarship & college information and the Lew-Port website is up & running
- Our Library Media Specialist, Mrs. Faut, works with classroom teachers to develop curriculum and assignments that cover various levels of research, utilize our vast collection of library resources and online databases, and involve the use of technology in the acquisition, information collection, and presentation of information. The projects and lessons address both AASL (American Association of School Libraries) Standards as well as the standards of each particular content area.
- Reading Plus has been instituted in Grades 9-12. It is designed to assist in elevating student reading comprehension skills.

- We are looking into a program where students can train to become certified Dell technicians, and they can then handle many Chromebook repairs in-house. This would possibly become a credit-bearing program for the students.
- The Academy of International Business & Finance, under the new leadership of JoAnn Allender, is moving ahead with great enthusiasm
- Keeping with tradition, kindergartners were here to visit with Santa, make holiday crafts, listen to stories and enjoy holiday music & snacks.
- Career Exploration Internship Program (CEIP) is continuing to grow, with over 25 students currently enrolled.
- DECA For 5 consecutive years students have won at the Regional & State competitions, which qualifies them for the international competition.
