# Health Office Information

#### **NEW HEALTH EXAMINATION REQUIREMENTS for 2018-2019**

Effective July 1, 2018, health examinations will be required in grades Pre-K or K, 1, 3, 5, 7, 9, and 11. For PEC students, this is a change from 2nd grade to 1st and 3rd grades. This must be signed by a NYS Physician, Nurse Practitioner, or Physician Assistant on an approved NYS School Health Examination form.

When your child has their physical or gets immunizations during the school year or in the summer, remember to request a copy for the school or request that the doctor's office fax it to the school. This will save you from having to retrieve it for the beginning of the school year. The PEC fax number is 286-7855.






### February is Black History Month


Students in Mrs. Chapman-Price's class have been learning about the impact African Americans have made throughout American history.

















# MOST VALUABLE TEAM PLAYERS

## Reading Buddies



I'm excited to announce that our fourth spring season for the Girls on the Run program will be starting in March! We had a very successful season last year and we are looking forward to coaching a new team!

Girls on the Run® is a 501(c)3 non-profit organization dedicated to creating a world where every girl knows and activates her limitless potential and is free to boldly pursue her dreams. Meeting twice a week in small teams of 8-15 girls, we teach life skills through dynamic, conversation-based lessons and running games. The 20lesson curriculum is taught by certified Girls on the Run coaches and includes three parts: understanding




ourselves, valuing relationships and teamwork and understanding how we connect with and shape the world at large.

Running is used to inspire and motivate girls, encourage lifelong health and fitness, and build confidence through accomplishment. At each season's conclusion, the girls and their running buddies complete a 5k running event. Completing a 5k gives the girls a tangible sense of achievement as well as a framework for setting and achieving life goals. The result—making the seemingly impossible, possible and teaching girls that they can accomplish their goals!
