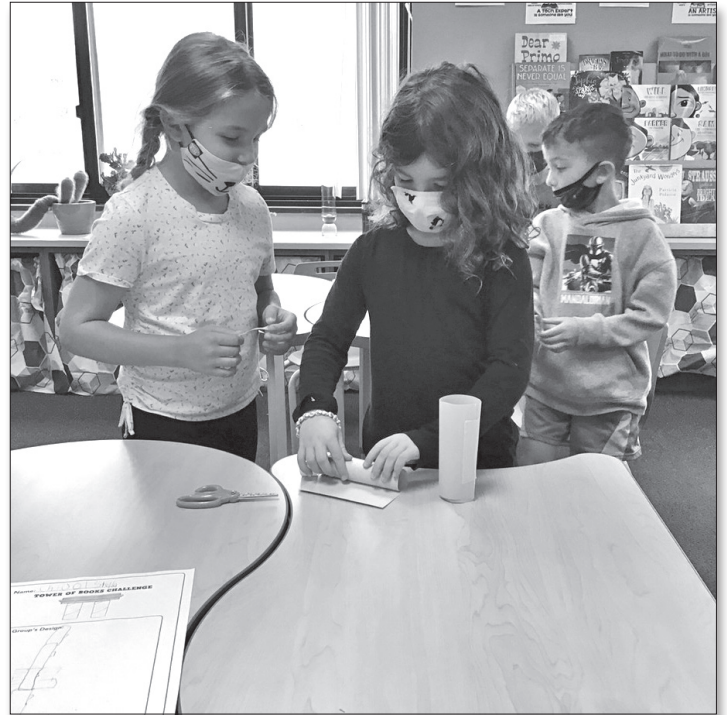

Lew-Port Grad Highlighted at Buffalo International Film Festival

2016 graduate Jack Gatto recently had one of his short animation films shown at the Buffalo International Film Festival in October. The event champions regional, national, and international films that push the limits of independent cinema – presenting quality films from around the world to Western New York residents and visitors. Jack says, “It was super fun to be in the film festival! Everyone there was super nice, and it was cool getting to meet people in the Buffalo area who are into making movies!”

Jack points to his time in the Animation, Film and Visual Effects program at the Niagara Career and Technical Education Center for helping with his success as an independent animator. “The best thing that I got out of the class was being surrounded by peers who had similar interests as me! Additionally, the class really put into perspective the sheer amount of knowledge a career in entertainment requires. So, it really helped solidify my understanding of the tough path ahead of me.”

Jack and one of his classmates at Orleans/Niagara BOCES, Geoff Roberts, along with several other friends recently formed an animation team over the past year called MudRoom. “We have one video on our channel so far, a parody of the popular game “Among Us”, says Jack. “It has 6.4 million views, which is a pretty big deal! We’ve also been commissioned twice now by FlashGitz (a separate YouTube channel) where the comedy is more adult and edgy. We did parodies of “Nightmare Before Christmas” and “Rudolph”. Other work includes making 3D video thumbnails for the channel OneyPlays and animations with MeatCanyon as well. “One video I made with MeatCanyon reached #1 trending on YouTube, which was a pretty big deal for him and me,” says Jack. He says his future plans include a move to Los Angeles to try to break into the business there.
