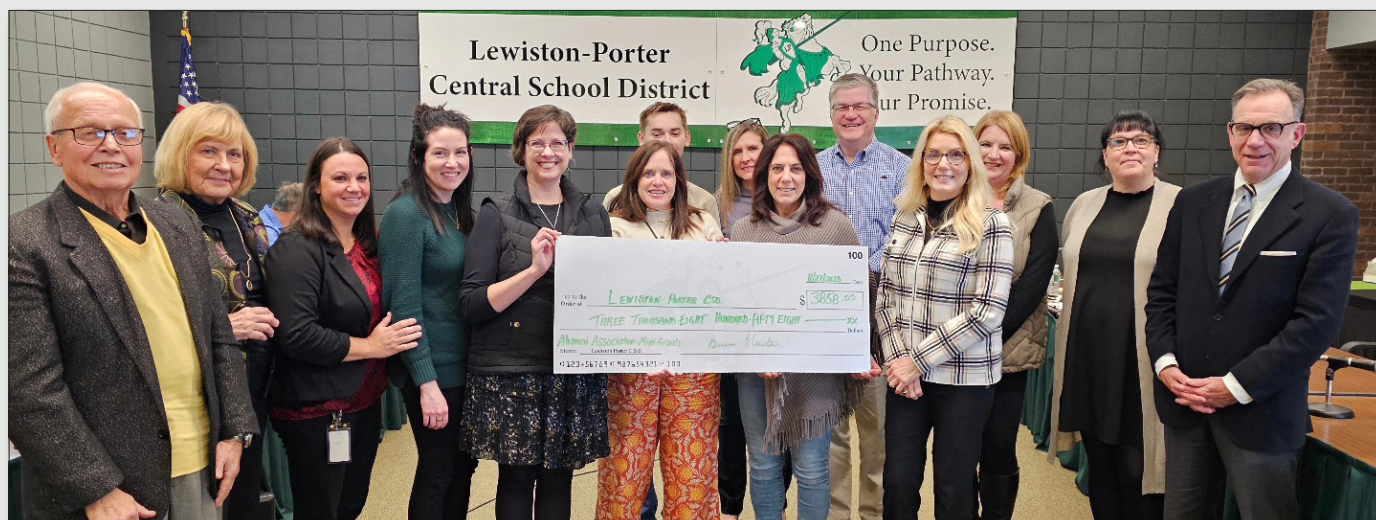
Rafting Adventure for Students

Kimberly Alexander Carlo Presented Prestigious Milken Educator Award

At Lewiston-Porter Middle School, Kimberly Alexander Carlo and her seventh grade science students are usually hard at work piecing together hypotheses and conducting thrilling, hands-on classroom experiments. However, at an all-school assembly derailed their plans — in a good way. A school visit from New York State Education Commissioner Dr. Betty A. Rosa quickly turned into an exciting surprise celebration for Alexander Carlo, the first educator in Lewiston-Porter Central School District history to receive the prestigious national Milken Educator Award.

Milken Educator Awards Senior Program Director Greg Gallagher was joined by Dr. Rosa to present Alexander Carlo with the honor before cheering students, colleagues, dignitaries and media. The Award recognizes outstanding K-12 educators nationwide for their excellence and leadership in the profession and provides recipients with an unrestricted \$25,000 cash prize to match the significance of their job.

Alexander Carlo is the sole New York Milken Educator Award recipient this season and is one of up to 75 recipients across the county that will be honored in 2023-24 as part of the Milken Family Foundation's Journey to the 3,000th Milken Educator. Hailed as the "Oscars of Teaching," 2023-24 will reach \$75 million in individual financial prizes spanning the length of the initiative and more than \$144 million invested in the Milken Educator Award national network overall, empowering recipients to "Celebrate, Elevate, and Activate" the K-12 profession and inspiring young, capable people to pursue teaching as a career.

Lewiston-Porter Superintendent Paul Casseri said, "It is with immense pride and joy that we announce a significant achievement within our Lewiston-Porter school family. Kim Alexander Carlo, a Middle School Science teacher and a proud alumna of the LP Class of 2011, has been honored with the prestigious Milken Family Educator Award." He added, "Kim was selected for this award not only because of her exceptional work as a 7th-grade science teacher but also for her dedication to social-emotional learning at the Middle School. Her involvement in the development of the CREW program stands as a testament to her commitment to our students' holistic growth."

Middle school Principal Andrew Auer noted, "Kim teaches Science 7 at the middle school and is an integral part of the seventh-grade team. Not only is Kim an expert in science, but she is also renowned as one of the leading voices of the Habits of Mind (HoM) in the Western New York Area. Mrs. Carlo routinely incorporates these strategies into her daily lessons, as well as uses them to determine which students might be up for the challenge of Earth Science as advanced 8th graders. She continues to work closely with her alma mater Niagara University in developing STEM and STEAM programs with an esteemed group of professionals throughout the country." Additionally he said, "Kim is a member of the Middle School Restorative Practices team that works to create an equitable and positive school culture. The group also represents a group of turnkey teachers and administrators that work with other untrained members of the staff to embrace Restorative Practices."

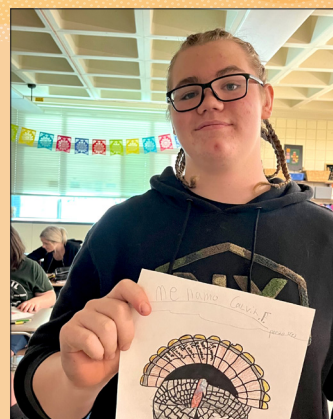

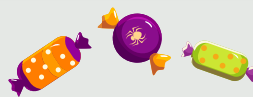

Lewiston-Porter's International Programs Have Been Busy This Year!

Science students travel to Japan and Australia:

In January 2023, nine students along with Mr. Casseri and Mr. Sharpe, traveled to Kyoto, Japan, to participate in the Sakura Science Program Exchange, a program sponsored by the Japanese government and Ritsumeikan High School in Kyoto. Lewiston-Porter's students participated in scientific challenges and presented their research projects along with students from schools all over the world. Students not only shared their love of all things science but also shared their different cultures.

Lewiston-Porter teachers, Ms. Glor and Mrs. Hurtgam escorted four high school students back to Japan to participate in the 2023 Japanese Student Science Fair this past November. Again, students enjoyed the enriching experience of a face-to-face exchange that allowed them to share their scientific knowledge and expertise. Students also had time to tour Kyoto to experience traditional Japanese culture and cuisine.

Finally, High School Principal, Mr. Chris D'Anna, and Living Environment teacher Mr. James Wanamaker, traveled to Brisbane, Australia, with three students, from December 1st – 8th for the 2023 International Student Science Fair (ISSF). Again, our students presented their scientific research with other students from around the world. Students engaged in authentic scientific activities with like-minded peers on a global scale. Students presented their research and defended their findings in a non-competitive environment. A significant component of the International Student Science Fair is the cultural and social interactions, and establishing international and lifelong friendships amongst participants.



International Exchanges:

In October Lewiston-Porter High School welcomed twelve students and two teachers from our partner school, Ernestinenschule Gymnasium High School from Lindau, Germany. The students stayed with Lewiston-Porter students and their families, attended classes with their hosts, visited the Niagara Power Authority, took a ride on the Maid of the Mist, and were able to experience the traditions of a typical American High School student, such as the homecoming dance, school athletics, and trick or treating on Halloween.

Our exchange program with Ernestinenschule was established in 2019 and this is the second time we have hosted students from Lindau. Lewiston-Porter students will travel to Lindau, Germany as part of the exchange program in July 2024. Students will stay with host families (some being the same students that they hosted here at Lewiston-Porter), visit local attractions, and travel to Munich and Berlin to round out the trip. Coming in March 2024 ... Lewiston-Porter will welcome students from our partner school, Ritsumeikan High School from Kyoto, Japan in March 2024. This is in collaboration with our new exchange program with Ritsumeikan and will include an annual exchange of students between the two schools. Each year the two schools will visit each other for approximately ten days and share scientific knowledge and ideas with each other. Students will also participate in local excursions and culture.



Lewiston-Porter's Chinese Language Program Hosts Conference:

The 2nd Annual Chinese Language Education and Administration Development Conference for New York K-12 Schools, sponsored by the Center for Bridging Cultures and hosted by Lewiston-Porter Central School District at Niagara Crossings Hotel and Spa, was held on November 3 and 4, 2024. Approximately fifty total teachers, administrators, parents, and students from across New York State came together to promote Chinese language and culture by sharing innovative teaching strategies, forging partnerships, and sharing ideas and strategies to support Chinese language and culture programs in K-12 schools. Participants attended sessions and workshops on various topics of developing, sustaining, and promoting Chinese language and culture programs. Presenters included Candace Black of the New York Department of Education, Yu Yougen Deputy Secretary General and Educational Counsellor of the Chinese Consulate in New York, and Ding Wang-Bramlett of the Department of Modern Languages at Carnegie Mellon University, just to name a few. In addition to the presentations and workshops, participants enjoyed a dinner followed by cultural performances performed by Lewiston-Porter elementary and secondary students, conference attendees, and members of the WNY Chinese Club.
